DEFINING THE NEED

During fiscal year 2015, 23,026 children in the St. Louis area were reported to the Missouri Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

FAMILY REUNIFICATION SERVICES

- Intensive, short term, home-based intervention services to reunify children in out-of-home placement (state custody) with the child's family
- Concentrated intervention to help families learn to nurture children and improve family functioning

FAMILY TREATMENT

- Individual and family therapy for children and adults, provided in-home and in-office
- Group therapy and psycho-educational group services for children, adolescents, and adults
- Psycho-social and diagnostic assessment and evaluation
- Family support and resource coordination services
- Parenting Wisely program providing evidence-based parenting instruction

FOSTER CARE SERVICES

- Case management and in-home support services provided to children residing in foster care, their foster families, and their biological families
- Recruitment, training, licensing, and assessment of foster and adoptive parents
- Family Resource Center is a member of Children's Permanency Partnership's (CPP), a consortium of child welfare organizations also including Epworth Children & Family Services and Youth In Need that provides foster care case management and resource development through a contract with the Missouri Children's Division

MISSOURI MENTORING PARTNERSHIP

- Job readiness training, job placement and support for disadvantaged youth
- Education and support for pregnant and parenting youth
- Mentoring, advocacy, and support for participants in the St. Louis City Family and Juvenile Drug Courts

PATHBUILDERS®

- Joint effort with the Brown School of Social Work at Washington University to break the cycle of child abuse and neglect
- 18-24 month program to help families at-risk for chronic abuse achieve a level of self-sustainability
- Collective Impact approach using community partnerships to address families' emotional and psychological needs, concurrent with removing social and environmental obstacles to success

REDEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR WOMEN (ROW)

- Innovative economic intervention services for low-income women and women experiencing financial hardship who have been impacted by domestic violence
- Language accessible advocacy and crisis support for non-English speaking survivors of domestic violence
- Parent training and support to improve the overall emotional, physical, and behavioral health of low-income women, and their children in order to build strong, self-sufficient families

THERAPEUTIC PRESCHOOL

- Intensive day treatment for children experiencing emotional and behavioral problems
- Specialized treatment for young victims of child abuse and neglect, and domestic violence
- Highly structured therapeutic approach involving cognitively oriented early childhood curriculum, play therapy, and behavior modification
- Family therapy and parenting counseling integrated with the child's treatment
